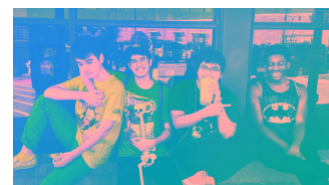


A Yoga Mat Won't Fix Your Moral Injury

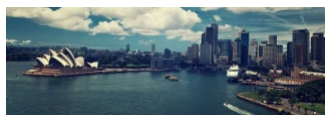
