

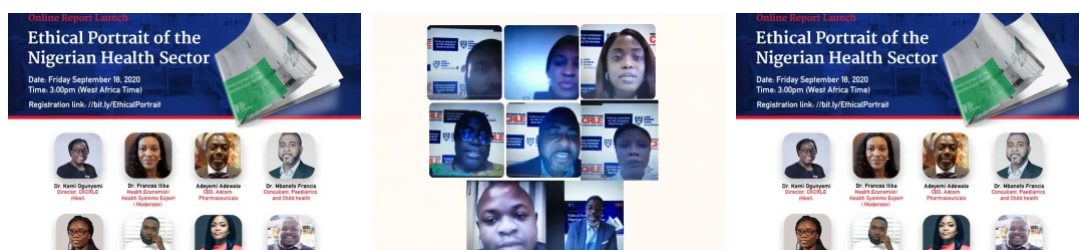

Report Launch-Ethical Portrait of the Nigerian Health Sector

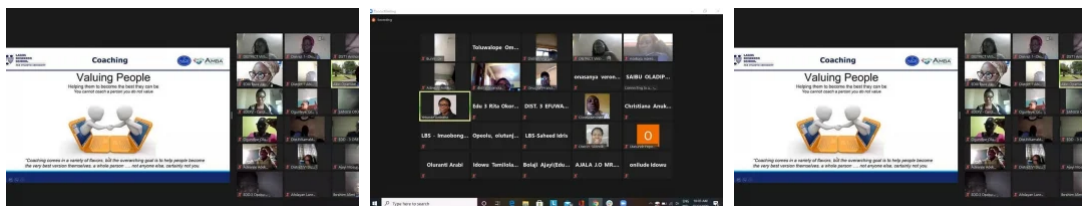
Christopher Kolade Centre for Research in Leadership and Ethics on the 18th September, 2020 held an online launch for its health sector report titled 'Ethical Portrait of the Nigerian Health Sector'. The launch was attended by about 80 participants. Dr Yetunde Anibaba, the author and lead researcher of the study that birthed the report gave a brief about the background and findings of the research. The research explored the level of ethical awareness and practice in the delivery and receipt of healthcare services across different regions in the country. There was a panel session comprised of key players in the health sector, among which was Adeyemi Adewole, the CEO of Adcem
