The World's Most Ethical Companies historically outperform their peers and competitors financially, demonstrating a tangible ROI for doing the right thing. The connection between good ethical practices and financial performance, called the Ethics Premium, has been tracked for 16 years.

In 2022, 136 organizations are recognized for their unwavering commitment to business integrity. The honorees span 22 countries and 45 industries, and include 14 firsttime honorees and 6 organizations that have been named to the honoree list 16 times, marking every year since its inception.

In what ways can leadership development help to prepare responsible ethical leaders?


How is sustainability and ethics reflected in public policies in Africa? How can
